

LOST PLACENAMES ON SCAPLAY



These placenames, the majority of which are held in memory as opposed to appearing on maps, were gathered by Ella Leith during the survey in July 2007. A number of residents were interviewed and these interviews provided the data below. Key participants were Kenneth MacLeod (KMCL), Morag MacLeod (MMcL), Donald MacSween (DMcS), Alasdair MacLeod (AMcL), John MacSween (JMCS) and John MacAulay (JMCA) who also kindly made available early charts. Morag MacLeod also carried out some of the fieldwork. Wherever possible names were checked out in the field.
